From fishing to boy racers -GPCA meeting update

Fishing, rats and boy racers - some of the topics touched on by the Goldsworth Park Community Association at its meeting in September.

But the main discussion centered on a plan for improvements of the recreation ground. The proposals, developed by Woking Borough Council and publicised by the GPCA, included two junior footballs pitches and raised concerns over parking and intrusion on nearby gardens. Some residents wanted extra car parking added at the same time as the pitches to cope with the increase expected. Cllr Saj Hussain gave assurance this would be provided. Boy racers - Residents thought the proposal of a 5-metre wide cycle track was excessive and would be used by "boy racers" in cars and on motorbikes, causing a disturbance. It was suggested that the track be reduced in width.

Fishing – Roger Westcott reported that the Angling Club has been a great success in its first six months, and that money raised would go to improvements and maintenance of the lake.

Rats - They are still a problem around the lake and adjacent gardens, but are now being dealt with by a new company, Monitor. If you see a rat, dead or alive, report it to the council



Merger approved for local hospitals' trusts

Final clearance has been given for the merger of the Ashford and St Peter's Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust and the Royal Surrey County Hospital NHS Foundation Trust.

This will allow the hospitals to deliver an important number of patient benefits, including more consultant care at weekends and increased investment in facilities and technologies.

Dog owners: is your animal microchipped?

Woking Borough Council is urging dog owners to get their pet microchipped before new legislation comes into force.

The Government is introducing compulsory microchipping for all dogs from 6th April 2016, to help reunite owners with their lost or stolen pooches, relieve the burden on animal charities and local authorities and promote responsible dog ownership.

Government figures reveal that more than 100,000 dogs are dumped or lost each year, at a cost of £57m to the taxpayer and welfare charities.



The microchips are coded with the owners' details, and owners who do not comply could face fines of up to £500.

An introduction to...

Goldsworth Park Community Association

The Goldsworth Park Community Association (GPCA) was formed when the estate was first built in the 1970s to look after the interests of the residents, promote the benefits of the area and establish a community centre, and it is still doing all that today.

At the heart of the area are the lake and the newly re-built community hall. The lake, apart from being a restful area for walkers and birdwatchers, has also become the focus for more activities, supported by the GPCA. A newly formed fishing club has already attracted a sizeable membership and earlier this year it was the venue for dragon boat races in aid of Woking Hospice.

Originally part-funded by the estate developers and aided by subscriptions from residents (do you remember the "buy a brick" campaign?), the community hall has for years been the centre for many of the clubs and organisations operating within the Park.

A fire severely damaged the building three years ago, but it has now been rebuilt to modern standards and in its six months of return to operation has hosted many events and parties.

Apart from these major areas of activity, the GPCA continues to play an important role in looking after the overall and sometimes individual interests of residents. Working with Woking Borough Council, which invested in the redevelopment of the community hall, the GPCA represents the interests of its residents in continued liaison with the council, ensuring that developments in the Park take into account local concerns. Planning applications, including the development of the shopping and commercial areas, are monitored and residents' views are taken to the council. For example, if it had not been for the tireless campaigning by the GPCA's Chair and members, the council would have removed the public toilet in the recreation ground and not replaced it.

GPCA Chair Irene Watson says: "While it is important to monitor and discuss the bigger development issues, we don't lose sight of the needs of individual residents and from time to time have been able to help. Every resident is important to us, and every resident is a member of the GPCA."

Please be reassured that Surrey Police will again be working with its partners on Bonfire Night to ensure that last year's drop in anti-social behaviour is maintained.

There will be additional patrols throughout Surrey to make it clear to potential troublemakers that criminal offences will not be tolerated.

Follow this advice to stay safe on Bonfire Night:

- Keep fireworks in a closed box
- Follow the instructions on each firework
- Light at arm's length using a taper
- Stand well back
- Once a firework has been lit NEVER go back – even if it hasn't gone off it could still explode
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves
- Keep pets indoors

A burglary at home is distressing and can have an impact on the whole family. Please keep your doors secured, even when at home.

- Don't leave valuables on display

Engage launches Christmas gift scheme



From the Lakeside

■ Roger Westcott is Club Secretary and fishing bailiff working in partnership with Woking Borough Council to oversee fishing, monitor fish stocks and other wildlife, and keep the area generally clean and tidy.

October 1st marked the beginning of the Pike season on the lake. Within days of the start, a number of good-sized fish, up to 15lbs or so, were recorded. With much larger fish present, catches are sure to improve as temperatures fall during the winter months. As the water cools, we should also see the end of the algal bloom that has blighted the scene for so much of the summer. We will be checking oxygen levels as the algae sinks and rots off. Next spring, we will add more barley straw to the water in the hope that we won't have a recurrence.

From October 1st, anglers can purchase a half-price half-season permit to fish the lake; perfect timing for a spot of winter "piking" – as the water cools and clears, these "big-uns" will be on the munch. Or maybe it is those big winter roach and perch that take your fancy. No need to book; just come on down, have a cast – daylight hours only – and one of our bailiffs will pop around to issue a day or half-season permit.

A few weeks ago, a pair of rather cute little ducks, one white and one black with a white bib, appeared on the lake. They are clearly domesticated and very tame; so tame we worry for their safety. I have contacted the RSPCA in the hope of discovering a report of missing ducks, but no joy. If anyone has any idea where they came from, please call me, the Council or the GPCA. With so many foxes, dogs and cats on the park, if we don't hear from their rightful owners within the next



couple of weeks, we will consider moving them to a safer pond.

From cute ducks to not-so-cute rats – despite the best efforts of the Council and their pest-control teams, rats are still a big problem around the lake. Bait stations are in use but seem to have little effect on rat numbers. We will be meeting with the Council shortly to discuss other ways of dealing with the problem but, in the meantime, we must all do what we can to discourage them by not

feeding then inadvertently while feeding the birds. May I remind you not to throw food on the ground – only onto the water – and not bread, please; corn or pellets are much healthier for the ducks and swans and are less likely to attract the rats. NO FOOD = NO RATS.

At present, there are a number of swans on the lake, so territorial skirmishes will happen. One rather handsome male finds it safer to spend much of the time on the bank near the children's play area. He is very friendly and quite harmless but as soon as he enters the water, the others attack. I hope he will soon fly off and find somewhere he will be accepted but until then, if you pass him, give him a wide berth and, if you have a dog, put it on the lead.

And finally, in early October, a number of our anglers got together for an autumn tidy-up round the lake, trimming overhanging branches and cutting back some of the reeds beside the platforms. Hopefully, in the coming weeks, they will top-dress the platforms with woodchips, helping to keep our park a pleasurable place to be. Thanks, guys.

Local gardeners win awards

Goldsworth Park gardeners and growers were among the winners at the recent annual Woking in Bloom and Allotment Awards, held at HG Wells Conference and Events Centre. In the Leam Challenge Shield for best newly cultivated plot, Ms C Lawrance, Goldsworth Park Allotments, was Joint 2nd.

Keep warm and save money

There are still more than 200 grants of £5,000 available for Woking residents to assist them in the installation of solid wall insulation. This announcement was made following a grant to an Old Woking householder. After a Green Deal Assessment of the home, arranged by Action Surrey, the resident was provided with recommendations on how to improve his home's energy efficiency, and saved more than £200 a year on his energy bills by installing solid wall insulation. Financial assistance from Streets Ahead, which covered almost all of the cost, meant that he only had to contribute a few hundred pounds.
